- Reserves: We currently have 5 POST Certified Reserve Officers. 3 are working and exceeding their required time. 1 is on leave with the military but still working on projects for the department. 1 is struggling to maintain his hours and graduate from our Field Training Program (he has one week left).
- Nunn Police Cadets: We are starting with two cadets one female and one male, both students at CSU & UNC
 respectively. Their primary functions will be helping out with court, assisting the police with non-emergency
 matters, as well as riding along with our officers. Both are Law Enforcement oriented and plan on LE for a career.
- Nunn Part Time Police Officer: Our new part time officer is Brandon LeFevre. Brandon spent 5 years with Castle Rock P.D. He is currently a programmer in the oil industry. Brandon lives in Pierce and that fact has already helped us out.
- Police Vehicles: All four of our patrol vehicles are currently running well.
- V,I,N, Program: Officer Jackson brought \$15,000 last Friday. He advised that he greatly appreciates the salary increase.
- RMS: Will take about 6 weeks for Edicia to build the program and training (\$9,000). By 2021 all departments will have to have a RMS to report.
- Policy & Procedure Manuals: Lexipol will update and keep our policy and procedure manuals current with state statutes (\$3,000).
- Handheld Radios: Weld County is upgrading their system so we will have 3 years to replace / upgrade our radios (approximately \$35,400).

Town Clerk Report:

- The 2019 Budget has been submitted, I included your copy in the packet.
- The new Building Manager with Safebuilt, Caleb Sulzen, will be here next Tuesday at 2:00 p.m. to review Building Code updates. This will require change by Ordinance so the updates can be reviewed at a future Work Session.
- Highway Use Tax Mileage Certification for the Town of Nunn was completed earlier this month. We will have changes for the next year filings due to added roads and/or length of roads.
- Pinnacle Workman's Comp Audit was completed for the 2018 audit year. Monthly premiums are not expected to be lowered despite no claims for this last year.

- Town Attorney Matt Gould has been reviewing the Xcel Energy Franchise agreement which needs to be updated this year.
- Weld County Sheriff's Office will be sending a new contract for Weld County Jail costs for review that needs to be signed by mid-March, 2019. This item may need to be included on a future Work Session.
